WHAT IS ART OF SOCIAL INNOVATION?

AoSI is an intensive 3 day experiential training that focuses on convening strategic conversations as a driver for development and change. The methods, practices and theories used throughout have been developed by the Art of Hosting community of practice. These approaches scale up leadership from the personal to the systemic using personal practice, dialogue, facilitation and the co-creation of innovation to address complex challenges.




WHAT TO EXPECT:
